obedience UNDER PRESSURE



The story of Abraham's obedience is a hard story to process when it stands alone. If the first passage you read about Abraham is Genesis 22, you might be frustrated and confused. So, let's bring some context to the story. The practice of child sacrifice, although completely evil, was a normal practice in Abraham's culture and time. Other god-systems in the ancient Eastern world would regularly practice child sacrifice. But God sets himself apart from any other god in this moment. God's plan was never for Abraham to sacrifice Isaac, as we clearly see through his provision. His purpose was to show Abraham that he was not like those other gods. Abraham could trust him. God would provide the sacrifice – every single time.

By faith, Abraham obeys and demonstrates his trust in God (<u>Hebrews 11:17-19</u>). Through his example, we learn that obedience won't always align with our feelings or desires. Focusing on the ask and potential loss can prevent us from really seeing God as good and faithful. He is the one who provides. He blesses when we are faithful. So, are you obedient to God or to your feelings?
